Reaching the Unreached Tanzania (RUT) is a national voluntary based non-governmental organization (NGO) works to address public health issues and promote justice in Tanzania. RUT works extensively around the areas of Reproductive Health & Family Planning, Nutrition, HIV, AIDS and STIs, Legal Empowerment, Gender Based Violence and Climate Change.

To support the community in attaining better health, fight against gender and children violence through community-based programs and interventions.

The goals of the organization are:

Our Impacts in 2019

Highlights

Six (6) Projects were implemented in ten wards (10), three (3) districts in Dodoma region, Tanzania. The districts include Kongwa district, Kondoa district and Dodoma municipal.

1. The FGM Free Generation (FFGP)

Through funding from Grand Challenges Canada (GCC), the project aims at improving sexual and reproductive health (SRH) through addressing/ending Female Genital Mutilation. The project is undertaken in two districts namely; Kongwa and Kondoa districts, Dodoma region. The project has four main components;

- i. Initiating new forms of income generating activities that create opportunity for women who financially benefit from FGM to opt for other sources of income.
- ii. Provision of psychosocial support to FGM victims
- iii. Awareness creation on the consequences of FGM to SRHR
- iv. Legal empowerment for women, girls and children to understand their rights in relation to FGM practices

Therefore, RUT successfully achieved the following during the implementation of the FFGP project;

- i. 108 (81 females and 27 males) intermediaries were identified and trained on FGM/C and its impacts on the women's SRHR. The intermediaries include health workers facility based (i.e. nurses), health workers non-facility based (i.e. community health workers), non-health service providers (i.e. teachers, peer educators), family members, religious leaders, and traditional leaders.
- ii. Twenty-two (22) centres/facilities where established for project staff to deliver SRH services
- iii. FGM knowledge and its impacts on SRHR has been imparted to 4010 beneficiaries (women/girls) through Information.
- iv. Thirty-four (34) female genital cutters (Ngaribas) have so far been identified and provided with education/knowledge.
- v. FGM knowledge and its impacts on SRHR to girls and women has been imparted to 1374 members of general public includes; men, boys and elders.
- vi. 368 potential beneficiaries were provided with psycho-social support and services.





2. Tanzania Youth Champions' Academy to Strengthening Skills of Youth Advocates for SRHR (TYCA 4 YAS)

In partnership and through financial support from Women's Global Network for Reproductive Rights – Africa (WGNRR -Africa), the project aims at strengthening capacity of youth aged 15-21 years to undertake SRHR advocacy work. The project is implemented in Dodoma municipal.

- The project has managed to reach 17 youths who participated in the need's assessment.
- 8 youths were recruited to be SRHR champions who will be trained in early 2020.
- RUT also conducted needs assessment in other six districts including Ilemela and Mwanza districts in Mwanza region, Kasulu and Kigoma municipal in Kigoma region, and Kigamboni and Temeke districts in Dar es Salaam region.



3. Green Initiative Project



This is an organization own initiative project to conserve environment and respond to climate change. RUT considers environment conservation and protection in its operations.

- The project enhancing communities' responsive action towards climate change and variability adaptation and mitigation action.
- Engage community leaders and stakeholders in dissemination of climate change knowledge for enhanced political commitment.
- Impart knowledge of local climate change manifestations to the local communities.
- The green initiative project has succeeded to establish tree nursery with 100 trees that will be planted in schools and establish school environment clubs for the environmental conservation in 2020.

4. Women Empowerment Project (WEP)

The Women Empowerment Project aim at improving the health and wellbeing of women by addressing Gender Based Violence particularly in the rural communities.

In 2019 the Women Empowerment Project (WEP) achieved the following:

Psychosocial Support

320 GBV survivors were provided with psychosocial support including provision of counselling and education on GBV and how to recover from the situation.

Legal Empowerment

- **66** were provided with education concerning laws that protect women and creation of awareness to women about their rights as human beings.
- Furthermore, **41** GBV survivors were linked to legal services.





5. Community Nutrition Project

It is a project aiming at improving health and nutrition status of women and children aged 0-14 years in Dodoma Region. The project was undertaken.

The project's main activities include community outreach to provide education to beneficiaries particularly pregnant women and lactating mothers. The project also works in health facilities to provide nutrition education to the RCH clinics, and nutrition counselling to pregnant women, lactating mothers and education on hygiene, conducting training on health and nutrition knowledge to school children, parents and guardians.





In 2019 the Community Nutrition Project (CNP) achieved the following:

Food and Nutrition:

- A total of 410 beneficiaries were reached for counselling and care in food and nutrition services such as education on food preservation, preparation of nutritious food and demonstration.
- The project reached 80 Breastfeeding women and provided them with knowledge on exclusive breastfeeding particularly on how to position their babies during breastfeeding and time duration of stopping it.

6. Ending Child Marriage Project

This project is aiming at ending child marriage through education in Dodoma region. The project comprises three components; (1) Advocacy (2) Awareness creation, skill and Capacity Building (3) Monitoring and Evaluation. The project deploys a number of evidence-based strategies including but not limited to girls empowerment, access to high quality education, advocate for supportive bylaws, laws and policies, mobilization of families and communities, engaging men and boys and safe space.

2019 Achievements

- The project was successful managed to reach 300 students and to provide education about ending child marriage
- Also the project succeeded to establish 15 students clubs to advocates about ending child marriage



Challenges

Apart from the project successes listed above, RUT encountered some challenges in implementing project activities and other connected processes. Below is a highlight of the challenges faced:

- Shortage of financial resources to expand coverage, and reach more wards, districts and regions for the purpose of serving many vulnerable people who are categorically unreached. Furthermore, RUT works in scattered remote areas located more than 100 miles from one implementation area (ward) to another. Moreover, since RUT works closely with trained and committed intermediaries who assists in projects implementation, the organization operates under limited budget to cover communication and transport allowances for all committed intermediaries.
- Community opposition; on some issues particularly changing some kind of behaviors which has been grounded from cultural beliefs.
- Communication barrier; most of the local women and girls in the project implementation area speak local/traditional language something gives difficult condition for our field staff to easily understand each other.

Strategies Used to Overcome Challenges:

- RUT continues to conduct fund-raising activities to mobilize resources for projects implementation. This include
 undertaking consultancies. But also, there has been individual contributions and organization income generating
 activities.
- RUT trained and selected committed intermediaries/ volunteers in each project area to assist the implementation of
 project activities. RUT only covers communication allowances for selected intermediaries who facilitate linkage
 between the organization and communities.
- RUT involves local government authorities in undertaking the activities. The organizations ensure that in each activity there is local government staff (district or ward staff) to support such activity.

Lessons Learnt

- Innovative behaviour changes approach that target the mindset among individuals in rural communities are required
 to address the complex interplay of different factors affecting the behaviour and understanding of the population in
 the Region.
- Joining efforts with other partners that includes local government leaders, community leaders, religious leaders, health workers, scientific societies, government, civil society organizations is critical to responding in a comprehensive manner to multiple community challenges.
- There are many unreached people in the society, however the extent of the needs differs among the community members. From the 2019 experience, RUT has realised that there is a great need of legal services to majority particularly women and girls.



Primary objective

- a) Review and test compliance with contractual obligations as set out in the contract between RUT and GCC, WGNRR, and other individuals who funded the organization.
- b) Determine whether the financial statements and the cash/bank/financial position present fairly, in all material respects, the income and expenditures of the project in accordance with an acceptable financial reporting framework.
- c) Determine whether the audit has uncovered any material weakness in relevant internal control.
- d) Determine whether receipts/income and expenditures are properly accounted for
- Determine whether the financial statements agree with the records and books of accounts maintained by the programme.

- f) Determine whether the expenditure incurred by the programme is properly documented and is in line with the budget.
- g) Determine whether the internal control system exists and is working efficiently to identify possible fraud or material misstatement.

Base of preparation

Statement of compliance

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with International Reporting Standards (IFRS) and its interpretation adopted by International Accounting Standards Board (IASB).

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with IFRS

The estimates and underlying assumption are reviewed on an on-going basis. Revision to an accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimates is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of revision and futures period if the revision affects both current and future periods.

Principal accounting policies

a) Going Concern

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of accounting policies applicable to a going concern. This basis presumes that funds will be available to finance future operations and that realization of assets and settlement of liabilities will occur in the ordinary course of business

b) Depreciation

Items of property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Depreciation is provided so as to write off the cost of fixed assets on straight-line basis over their expected useful lives. The principal annual rates used for this purpose are




